PRE-REQUISITE COURSE REQUIREMENT CHECKLIST

MATH COMPETENCY *Within one year prior to nursing application period*

COMPASS test score in college math showing placement level **above** INTERMEDIATE ALGEBRA

NOTE: All applicants are required to take the Math COMPASS test

ENGLISH COMPETENCY *Within one year prior to nursing application period*

COMPASS test score in reading and writing showing placement level at English 101

NOTE: All applicants are required to take the English (Reading and Writing) COMPASS tests

NOTE: A minimum grade of 2.0 is required for all of the pre-requisite courses.

ENGLISH COMPOSITION 5 college credits *No time limit*
 Course # at SCC: ENGL& 101 or ENGL& 102 *(Prerequisite: ENGL 100 or Satisfactory COMPASS test score),*

STATISTICS 5 college credits *(Prerequisite: (MATH 099 or MATH 97 and 98 and placement into ENGL 100 or ESL 100)*
 Course # at SCC: MATH&146 *within 10 years of application date*

GENERAL CHEMISTRY 5 college credits *(Prerequisite: (MATH 099 and ENGL 100 or higher)*
 Course # at SCC: CHEM& 121 *Within 5 years of application date*
NOTE: Must have supervised lab. *(Prerequisite: BIOL& 211)*

ANATOMY 5 college credits *(Prerequisite: BIOL& 211)*
 Course # at SCC: BIOL& 231
 (BIOL& 241 starting Winter 2016)

PHYSIOLOGY 5 college credits *Within 5 years of application date*
 Course # at SCC: BIOL& 232 *(Prerequisite: BIOL& 211 and BIOL& 231)*
 (BIOL& 242 starting Spring 2016)

MICROBIOLOGY 5 college credits *Within 5 years of application date*
 Course # at SCC: BIOL& 260 *(Prerequisite: BIOL& 211) and CHEM& 121 recommended)*
NOTE: Must have supervised lab.

LIFESPAN DEVELOPMENT 5 college credits *(Prerequisite: none.)*
 Course # at SCC: PSYC& 200

***NUTRITION** 3-5 college credits *(Prerequisite: none .CHEM& 121 helpful.)*
 Course # at SCC: NUTR& 101

NOTE: Not associated with admission points. Must be successfully completed before entering Nursing Program

FIRST AID
 We accept any current First Aid card for 1 point. This is not required, but provides additional points for admission.

HIV/AIDS - 7 HOUR AIDS & HIV EDUCATION FOR HEALTH CARE WORKERS
 This is required to meet the Washington State requirement for Health Care Workers and is required before entering the Nursing Program. Evidence of successful completion = 1 point.

CPR
 American Heart Association – Health Care Provider CPR. Current certification for one (1) point – this is required before entering the Nursing Program.

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**\*Take 5 credits if you plan to earn a four-year degree at some point in the future.**

**NOTE:** This is an advising checklist; it does not constitute acceptance of courses from other institutions as completion of pre-program requirements. If you have taken courses at other institutions not shown on our Course Equivalence Chart that you feel may count as pre-program requirements, please obtain a "Request for Transcript Evaluation" form from the web site and follow the directions as noted.

## Interested in the Shoreline Community College Nursing Program?

Follow these easy steps...

- If you haven't applied to SCC before or haven't taken (credit) classes here, you must apply for college admission *for the current quarter* (not for when you plan to apply). If you were admitted to SCC in the past, please contact SCC Admissions to activate your file *for the current quarter*.

- If you haven't taken college level English or math, take the COMPASS English and math placement exam.  
**NOTE:** COMPASS testing is required for:  
1. Initial placement into college level English and math, **AND** for  
2. Application screening within one year of application to the Nursing Program to demonstrate competence at ENGL& 101 in reading and writing and above Intermediate Algebra for math.

- Attend a Nursing Program information session. - *Not required but helpful to clarify questions*

- If you have attended other Washington state colleges, use the **Course Equivalence chart** from the Nursing Program Homepage by selecting the link **Course Equivalence Sheet** to assess which prerequisites you have credit for.  
**NOTE:** If you have attended out-of-state schools and have taken courses you think may apply to our pre-requisites, you must request a transcript evaluation and provide detailed course descriptions or syllabi. (*see next step*)
- Request a Transcript Evaluation -- *if necessary*. Most people with in-state courses can assess their pre-requisites using the **Course Equivalence Sheet**.  
The transcript evaluation form is available on the **Nursing Program Homepage**.  
**NOTE:** For transcript evaluation, print and complete the **Transcript Evaluation Request** form, attach detailed course descriptions and an unofficial copy of your transcript; bring in or mail to the Nursing office. Allow 4 weeks for results to be mailed to you.
- If you've completed all of the above steps and have remaining questions, make an appointment for individual advising by calling 206-546-4559 *or* come to drop-in advising in building 2300 during the academic quarter. (A minimum grade of 2.0 is required for all pre-requisite courses.)*
